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Camden Commitment Progress Report

PROMISE 1: Safe Students, Safe Schools. Your child will feel safe at school.

- Expanded summer learning opportunities, including new all-day programming, to reach more than 1,000 youth
- Partnered with community groups to raise awareness of need for greater transportation funding, options

PROMISE 2: 21st Century School Buildings. Your child will attend school in a modern building with top-of-the-line technology.

Partnered with Mastery in breaking ground on new school building at State and River in East Camden

PROMISE 3: Excellent Schools. Beginning in pre-K, your child will be able to attend a public school that meets students' unique needs and features excellent teaching and learning.

- Invested in new positions—including reading interventionist, operations manager, and family & operations coordinator—to support school operations and allow principals to focus on continuing to improve instruction
- Introduced plan for new interim assessments that will support data-driven instruction and provide additional training for teachers
- Launched three new teacher roundtables with educators of special education and bilingual students and with child study team members
- Partnered with high schools to hold first annual College Signing Days as part of #CollegeBoundCamden
- Held Attendance Carnival to celebrate perfect or near-perfect attendance of more than 600 students
- Provided up to 12 books to each student in grades K-5 to help prevent summer learning loss

PROMISE 4: Parent Engagement. You will have the information, services, and support you need to help your child succeed.

- Shared Camden Enrollment results with more than 2,500 students; more than 80% received top-three match
- Held first annual Family University Parent Empowerment Conference for more than 135 parents
- Partnered with Athlete Health Organization to provide free student-athlete physical screenings and make parents' lives easier

PROMISE 5: Central Office Effectiveness. You will be able to easily access information from an efficient and responsive Central Office that is focused on serving school communities.

- Developed and approved a 2016-2017 budget that shifts more resources to schools while minimizing the impact on personnel, including no tenured teachers impacted
- Held events organized by Core Values Coalition for all Central Office staff
- Launched pilot of Emergency Support for Families in partnership between Solutions Center and Center for Family Services



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2015 School Survey Data Overview

Surveys were administered in District and participating charter/renaissance schools in November/December 2015 to the following:


- Students in grades 4-12
- Parents (of all students)
- Staff (teachers, administrators, guidance counselors, CST members, paraprofessionals)

Survey topics include:

- Community & Collaboration: perceptions of communication and relationships among students and staff, and how well the school community works together
- Family & Community Engagement: Perceptions of parent and community involvement and satisfaction with the academic and social life of the school
- School Community Morale: pride and identification with the school's character, and the ability to rally to healthy and positive outcomes
- Safety & Physical Environment: attitudes towards school safely in and around the school building, and building use and scheduling
- Social & Emotional Supports Positive attitudes towards the school's social environment, individual emotional supports, and student behavior
- Teaching & Learning Positive attitudes towards the academic climate of the school, support for student development, and overall instructional quality




Parents

Most perceptions by parents have remained stable, with little or no change over three years. Perceptions of morale, and the safety-emotional environment have improved.





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


High School
