First Day of School











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
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2015-16 PARCC RESULTS SUMMARY CCSD: Proficiency

The results of the District show promising gains, but there remains a lot of work to do.

Overall, the District had over 120 more proficient students in math and nearly 250 more in English language arts.


2015-16 PARCC RESULTS SUMMARY CCSD: College and Career Readiness

Here are a few major focal points of this instructional work for 2015-16:


- 1. Adding operational support

When taken together, the results of the District and its renaissance partners show promising gains, but there remains a lot of work to do.


District and Renaissance Together, Grades 3-8






2015-16 PARCC RESULTS SUMMARY CCSD: Proficiency: K-8 school-level change

There was widespread improvement in math, and collectively we have a long way still to go.




Math Grades 3-8

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

ELA Grades 3-8



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



ELA – Same students








