District Highlights



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Accelerating Student Achievement

District CTE (Career and Technical Education) Department has released the CTE Program Guide to 8th Grade Counselors and Child Study Teams to aid families in the school choice process. The district offers 16 different labor market aligned pathways that offered industry recognized credentials upon graduation.

In December 2019, only one district program was State approved. We have since worked to ensure district programming was aligned to State Perkin's regulations.

State Approved Programs of Study: Partnered with a Post-Secondary Institution.

Cisco, Construction Trades, Engineering (New Program), Automotive Trades, Teaching/Education(New Program), Biomedical Sciences(New Program) and Business Entrepreneurship.

State Approved CTE Program:

Electrical Trades, CAD (Computer Aided Design), Apparel and Textiles, Hotel, Restaurant and Tourism Management (New Program).

Awaiting State Approval: Submitted in Substantially Approvalable Form

Allied Health(New Program), Dance, Graphic Arts, Criminal Justice (New Program) and Cosmetology (Cosmetology will be submitted shortly).



120 students who require transportation for hybrid learning


Notified by the County Commission and DOE that there is an extreme shortage of bus drivers

Return to In-Person Learning: April 12th



Can I still sign my child up for April 12th Hybrid?

- No, not for April 12th
- Hybrid Phase 2 will provide another opportunity
- We have to launch this first phase (April 12) safely before expanding

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






- The requirements of the grant funds explicitly state that the funds "must be used to address the health and safety measures necessary to support reopening of in-person instruction and to support students during periods of remote learning.
- The NJDOE is actively conducting a Consolidated federal monitoring of grants state wide
 - To-date, 57 LEAs across the state have been audited. 40
 LEAs were compliant and 17 LEAs had audit findings
 - LEAs with findings are referred to OFAC for determination and corrective action.







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
