












The Current Landscape






District-wide, the number of school buildings has remained constant since 2017-18, even as District-wide enrollment has continued to decline.




Misc. Other represents district items like instructional programs, student assessments, contracts for substitute teachers and paraprofessionals, legal contracts, utilities, etc.

Balanced Budget \$391,924,415 New total revenues for FY20: \$387,902,556



Top facilities concerns from parents and staff

- Average school building is over 60+ years
- 12+ instructional days lost last year due to emergency facilities failures

Each year, we typically spend:

- \$4m in scheduled repairs & maintenance
- \$3-5m in emergency repairs

Aging systems & infrastructure could fail at any time:

 We have identified \$122m in emergent and urgent projects on the horizon.
