- Regular Programming

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

Both in person and remote learning will prioritize student use of their 1:1 device

Safety measures that reduce the spread of COVID-19

Safety is our number one priority

- Regular Hand Washing
- Maintaining Social Distance (6ft or further)
- Minimize contact with others
- Wearing of Face Coverings
- Regular sanitation and cleaning of spaces/surfaces
- Increased ventilation
- Self-isolating when showing symptoms

Proper Hand Hygiene

- Sanitizing Stations throughout the buildings
 - Entrance/Exit
 - Main Office
 - Hallways
 - Each Classroom

- Regular reminders to sanitize

Social Distancing

- Desks separated by 6ft
- One way hallways
- Separate Entrances/Exits



- Students Grouped into Cohorts
 - No meals in building
- Limiting # of students staff would interact with
- One way hallways
- Separate Entrances/Exits
- Reducing/Eliminating Visitors
- Established Isolation rooms (if presenting symptoms)

Face Coverings

- Students and Staff (and any approved visitor) must wear a mask in order to keep everyone safe.
 - Medical exceptions will be considered
- CCSD will be providing families and staff with a reusable cloth masket
 - Will have emergency disposable masks if necessary for child/staff member
- In classes with greater PPE need, i.e a teacher/para working closely with a single student, CCSD will also provide additional PPE for that staff member.

Sanitation, Cleaning and Ventilation

Sanitation and Cleaning

- Continued use of disinfecting materials that are demonstrated in killing COVID and other flu-like strains
- Increased emphasis on cleaning regular touchpoints and locations
- Sanitizing materials will be readily available to staff to use in classrooms and across building so as to meet need and maintain distance

Ventilation

- Constant flow of air is key.
- CDC recommended filters being used in whole building HVAC systems
- Windows open, doors open, continuous movement of air from outside in and inside out.

Symptom Screening

- Daily screening of students and staff - to be conducted at home



If you are showing any symptoms, take the safest route - STAY HOME

100.4 degrees - is the threshold!

Transportation

- Working on securing regular transportation
- One individual per seat
- Masks must be worn at all times by all parties
 - Bus Driver & Aide
 - Students
- No eating/drinking on the bus
- Windows down as weather permits
- Key touch points on bus will be cleaned between runs
- Bus sanitized every night



Food Services

- Your child will have access to meals for every day of the school week (M-F)
- There will be restrictions to eating in the school building this will help reduce opportunities for spreading the virus

How CCSD is implementing safety procedures

Hand-washing	Sanitizing Stations in every classroom, hallways, office, and entry/exit		
Social Distance Classrooms set up with 6ft of space between desks			
Minimize Contact	Younger students kept in cohorts - staff transition (no visitors)		
Face Coverings	All parties wear masks (individual medical exemptions)		
Sanitation	Increased touch point cleaning throughout the day - nightly sanitation		
Ventilation Verified Filter Quality, increased air circulation, & no recycled air			
Symptom Screening	Training around screenings for students and staff (Onsite Isolation Room)		

"Opt-out" of in person Hybrid Learning


Student's completion of course work is still necessary

Contact IT Support	If your child's device does not appear to be working at a level of 100%, please contact our IT support - Mindshift (# is on the device)		

Wellness practices

Hand-washing	Reinforce the need to wash your hands regularly - even at home		
Social Distance Set up chairs 6ft apart at home and talk to your child about this being the they'll sit from their classmates when in school.			
Minimize Contact	Remind your child that they'll be with the same group of students each day and it will only be a small number of classmates - about 10 in total		
Face Coverings	Practice wearing masks in the house - and always wear outside the house		
Symptom Screening	Practice giving screenings with your child at home. Help them recognize the symptoms of COVID-19

- Updating cleaning and disinfecting procedures to meet CDC and EPA guidelines



Safe Schools Built for the 21st Century: Security




Reopening Preparation:




