## c. Oral Health Impact Project

It is recommended that the Health Services Department have permission for the Oral Health Impact Project(OHIP) serves the dental needs of the students in Camden City Public Schools. OHIP is responsible for furnishing, at its own expense, all necessary equipment and supplies and its own paid personnel, as determined by OHIP, for the proper and safe operation of its clinic at the Schools. OHIP shall provide Camden City with the forms necessary to obtain (i) parental consent for this service, (ii)billing information, (iii) medical history, and (iv) HIPPA privacy notices and related documents. Students will be eligible for services only upon the signing of a parental consent by either a parent or legal guardian. Camden City will assist OHIP in the distribution and collection of these forms Camden City understands that OHIP will seek payment for completed services from the New Jersey Department of Human Services and other insurance carriers for which the students are eligible. Camden City shall provide the information to OHIP necessary to seek such payments as authorized by the student's parent or guardian. Camden City shall not be responsible for the payment of completed services.

The dental treatment may include any or all of the following: Dental Exam and Diagnosis including X-Rays, Cleaning, Topical Fluoride Application, Preventative Sealants. Children may also be seen by the OHIP Dentist at the school for further dental treatment, if needed. The parents also give permission for their child(ren) to have minor fillings, removal of an infected nerve of a tooth (pulpotomy), with possible application of local anesthetic xylocaine most commonly called "Novocaine".

Our residents can also help the school nurse with vision and hearing screenings; they can review immunization records, they can help track growth and BMI changes.

c.IEP/504 meetings- The residents are willing to participate in social work/nurse meetings where students with specific health and/or psychological issues are reviewed. b. Stipends for District High School Science Teachers for After School Professional Learning Communities

IT IS RECOMMENED that permission be granted for the Division of School Support to provide stipends for all district high school science teachers for after school Professional Learning Communities.

The PLC is support that is beneficial for successful implementation of the PSI programs in chemistry, physics and biology across all of the district's high school buildings. This would help get all teachers across the district to collaborate and have high expectations across the board, while focusing on the fidelity of implementation and student success.

The PSI Physics and Chemistry PLCs will improve staff competencies for understanding and using assessment results. This will be accomplished by teachers bringing their assessments (quizzes and unit tests) to the PLC meeting. These assessments will be common assessments given across the district. Teachers can then compare to find common errors and pitfalls. While in the PLC the teachers will also be able to create groups of students who

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need help on a particular concept across different classrooms in a building. Those students could then be remediated together.

CTL staff would conduct the PLC's and have particular areas of focus for each one. This would in turn lead to capacity building in the district as all of the physics and chemistry teachers from across all of the different high schools would be in the CTL conducted PLCs. These teachers could then become leaders in their buildings for their building level PLCs by bringing back information from the across district Physics or Chemistry PLC.

During PLC time teachers will be given the tools necessary to dig deeply into their students' results. The PLC leader will demonstrate how to effectively analyze data and compare it across the high schools. The PLC leader will also be able to help the teachers figure out if the problems students are having are related to their math skills or to their understanding of the science concepts. Together plans for next steps in the classroom will be reached.

The CTL led PLCs will supplement district goals towards improving collaboration and communication among teachers, using assessments effectively, increasing the rigor of coursework, and preparing students for college and careers.

All High School Science teachers will receive the following stipend: Each teacher will meet 3 hours per month for 10 months
