B. Bilingual Department

1. Imagine Learning

IT IS RECOMMENDED that the Interim State Superintendent approves the implementation of the Imagine Learning Language Acquisition Program designed for ELL (English Language Learners) at Dudley Family School, Sumner Family School, Catto Family School and Molina Elementary School. The program will be offered to 701 ELL students in grades K- 5^{th.} The program will provide students/teachers with:

- A strong foundation in literacy by presenting a comprehensive, literature-based curriculum with direct, explicit instruction in phonological awareness, phonics, academic vocabulary, fluency, and comprehension.
- Information in a multi-modal format, including authentic music and art, engaging games, realia videos with peer modeling, immediate chances for repetition, and opportunities for students to record reading, singing, and chanting. These are all research-based best practice for ELL and students in special education.
- Adaptive assessment and internal feedback system within the program to identify specific learning gaps in student's literacy knowledge and provide a targeted approach to strengthen those areas. This information must be presented in real time.
- Real time ongoing formative data that can be used by teachers to utilize best practices to address individuals learning needs.

Bilingual Department, cont.

- Professional Development will take place throughout the year which includes:
 - ✓ Initials and follow up trainings- introducing teachers to the software management system, the activitybased curriculum, and the reports.
