It is <u>recommended</u> that permission be granted for Woodrow Wilson High School Tiger's Liar/School Based Youth Services host a blood Drive, through the American Red Cross, June 5, 2012, 9:30am – 3:00 pm in the cafeteria.

The American Red Cross will provide all materials, training, and supplies for the blood drive. Faculty, staff, and students ages 17 and older will be asked to donate blood.

B. National Coalition of 100 Black Women "Making Proud Choices"

It is <u>recommended</u> that permission be granted to School Based Youth Services to partner with the National Coalition of 100 Black Women Inc. (NCBW). Collaboration will focus on outreach efforts to adolescents and young adults ages 10 – 19, and their parents. NCBW, Southern New Jersey, will implement the program, and train staff in the Research Based Curriculum, "Making Proud Choices". Training will take place during the months of June and July. Implementation will start in July at the High schools and Middle schools.

The lessons are researched based and behaviorally focused as well as meeting the New Jersey Core Curriculum Standards for Health & Physical Education.
