2017-18 QSAC Self-reported Results Summary

What is QSAC? *The Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC)* is the State of New Jersey Department of Education’s monitoring and self-evaluation system for all public school districts.

Why does it matter? QSAC hold CCSD accountable to the same standards as other school districts in the state. It measures whether the practices and systems we have in place will build staff capacity and encourage long term improvement for students. QSAC ratings are a factor in the State Department of Education’s assessment of the effectiveness of State intervention.

Why now? Every three years, districts evaluate themselves against a number of measures in five key areas. These self-evaluation scores are reviewed and verified by the Camden County Superintendent of Education, who will give the District a final score.

***Additional context:** Student achievement, while steadily rising, is still far too low across the District. This is reflected in the “Instruction & Program” score.
