

Overall, the District had over 120 more proficient students in math and nearly 250 more in English language arts.


## **CCSD: College and Career Readiness**

- 3. Training teachers and principals



**District and Renaissance Together, Grades 3-8** 




**CCSD:** Proficiency: K-8 school-level change

# There was widespread improvement in math, and collectively we have a long way still to go.




#### Math Grades 3-8



**ELA Grades 3-8** 





ELA – Same students






