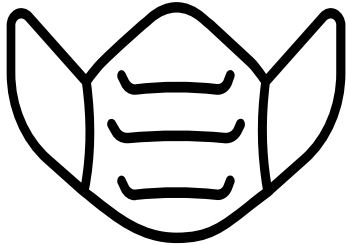

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**Driver shortage continues to diminish the services families have come to expect with transportation**

### Parental Transportation Contracts

- Contract is for up to \$1000 for the 2021-22 school year for the transporting parent/guardian
- To qualify a student must be eligible for transportation
  - More than 2.0 miles walking to school (+2.5 for 9-12)
  - IEP requests transportation
- Your child or their route has to be impacted the driver shortage
