
For our students in the **Summer Enrichment**, **ESY and Bilingual/ESLs Programs**, our curriculum is focused on the following:



The life skills program serves girls enrolled in middle and high schools in Camden, NJ schools. The curriculum includes financial literacy, stress management, family relationships, intimate partner relationships, health and wellness, and other relevant topics.





## **CAREER & WORKFORCE READINESS PROGRAM**

Women of the Dream's Career and Workforce Readiness Program prepares girls for life after high school. This includes assistance with college and trade school admission, financial aid, essay and resume writing, job readiness, and the Women of the Dream scholarship. Under the leadership of our fearless and extremely knowledgeable college prep instructor, Donna Baines, the program's goal is to ensure that all Women of the Dream senior participants leave high school with a definitive plan and the completion of all associated paperwork.


