- Finance & Operations Committee

- Ms. Alvarez reported out on behalf of the committee:

Finance

- The District is still awaiting final approval of the FY24 district budget from the County Office of Education. Once approved, the district will be able to begin preparing for those programs which will be occurring in the summer and throughout the 2023/2024 school year.

Operations

- Despite production delays, the district has received its initial order of five (5) 52-passenger school buses which have begun rolling through our City Streets. The district will be ordering seven additional busses, five (5) 52-passenger and two (2) 24-passenger, to expand the district owned fleet in the 23/24 school year.
- Yesterday a ribbon cutting was held for a new playground at Yorkship School. The playground was acquired and installed through a partnership with Subaru of America.
- We have installed new bleachers in the Eastside gymnasium and are currently working with our co-op vendors to purchase new, permanent bleachers at both of our high school athletic complexes.
- Our door alarm project has begun installation at Camden High School complex. The project will enhance safety and security on the campus by alarming all exterior doors creating an audible siren and camera imaging if a door is opened without authorization.
- The district is currently issuing bids for a number of facilities projects to occur over the summer and next school year.
- A new roof has been installed at Cream school which is one of many roofing projects throughout the district.
- We would like to wish all of our bus drivers a Happy National Bus Drivers Day and thank them for all they do for our students.

As a parent who has children in different schools sometimes it's hard staying involved when they're separated. But if I learn that trying is what matters most especially when you want to be more involved and active at their school. H.B Wilson calls me when something has happened or I need to pick up my child but not to invite me for any special events or even parent meetings. I feel like if my child sees me more involved or going to parent meetings other than when it's a bad day he will succeed more and want to do the same by being involved too. I was told that the school has a parent coordinator and I haven't met her. How can I be involved more at H.B Wilson other than feeling like an outsider. Sula Barroso	<p>Good evening my name is Sulma Barroso. I have a little girl who attends Thomas Dudley to him 3rd grade. Last month I asked if I could grab a voucher for uniforms for my student but no one has returned an answer. As you know children grow very fast and I as a mom who does not have a job it is difficult for me Buy uniforms every 2 to 3 months. I wanted to know if there are already funds to grab more vouchers for uniforms since it is recommended that my student wear a uniform from Monday to Friday. Last night I also went to a meeting at school and they did not tell me anything. This has me a little worried as my other girl is also going to start school this coming year 2023/2024. Thank you very much for your time.</p>
Katrina Squire	<p>Greetings to the Members of the CCSD Advisory Board & Superintendent McCombs,</p> <p>My name is Katrina Squire, and I am an ELA teacher at Veterans Memorial Family School. Over the past several years at Vets, we have been expanding our Social Emotional Learning practices throughout our building. Numerous teachers in the building are using circle practice to assist students in addressing their overall mental health. Circle practice provides a safe place for students to express their thoughts, feelings and at times, share traumatic experiences. We have also added daily schoolwide mindfulness practices to help students and staff regulate their parasympathetic nervous systems, which have recently been in overdrive due to the pandemic. Our NJEA ACCESS consultant has been coaching staff and participating with this work over the past several years (even during remote learning). I have shared a few reflections from students and staff members below.</p> <p>PEACE/ RESTORATIVE CIRCLE PRACTICE:</p> <p>"It's a way of getting things off of your chest. You can talk about your feelings. It calms me." 6th grader at VMFS</p> <p>"It opens up the lines of communication and lets teachers understand our students on a deeper level." - Teacher at VMFS</p> <p>"Peace Circles are really calming; we get to know each other and get to tell each other how we feel." - 3rd grader at VMFS</p> <p>"When I get angry, I use the breathing and I think about Peace Circles."</p> <p>- 3rd grader at VMFS</p> <p>"Peace Circles are fun, and I like responding to the questions. My favorite Peace Circle moment was when we had to invite a Black History Maker to the "party", because it felt like we were actually planning a party." 5th grader at VMFS - (during remote learning)</p> <p>MINDFULNESS TECHNIQUES:</p> <p>"It makes me feel grounded, secure and comfortable" - 8th grader at VMFS</p>

	<p>"It makes me feel ready to do what is next" - 6th grader at VMFS</p> <p>"I like the lion breathing and the five-finger rollercoaster breathing best." - 1st grader at VMFS during remote learning</p> <p>"All of the breathing exercises make me feel calm." - 1st grader at VMFS during remote learning</p> <p>"It gives me the chance to practice my English in a non-judgmental space" - Bilingual 6th grader at VMFS</p> <p>"It brings relief and helps me with my anxiety." - 6th grader at VMFS</p> <p>"It helps me fall asleep at night." - 2nd grader at VMFS</p> <p>The improved assessment scores, as well as other positive effects on our students and staff, can partially be attributed to these SEL practices. These practices have enabled our students reflect and focus.</p> <p>I would love to have this work replicated in every traditional public school in Camden to increase self-awareness and positive experiences, and to enhance the teaching and learning environments. Marisol Charernsook	<p>Greetings School Board Members, I am an employee of Camden City School District working as a school social worker. This year we had the opportunity to host and train three pre-service interns from the Human Service Program and one graduate intern from the Social Work Program. The interns were from Rowan and Walden University. The interns had the opportunity to be involved with the students, family, and community members. They were integral to the child study team. They were able to assist in reaching out to the parents, interpret for meetings, counsel students, and assist teachers with students' challenging behaviors by implementing positive and restorative practices in the classroom. They also had the opportunity to attend many events offered by Camden Education Association as well as the offerings from New Jersey Education Association through the ACCESS program. The interns participated in workshops and conferences on Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), Circle Practice, Positive Deviance and many more. Recognizing the benefits of the interns' experiences this year, we would like to continue to host interns in our department and provide the same opportunity to other departments within our great traditional public schools in CCSD. Teacher leadership allows better collaboration among educators that will improve student learning.</p> <p>School districts can use Title II funds from Every Student Success Act (ESSA) to fund this endeavor.</p> <p>While the district continues to hire new teachers, let us not forget the teachers who are currently in the district. He does not show our sport the same attention. He claims that he loves softball but does the bare minimum to keep the sport going. He is not a man of his word.</p>
Jayda Battle	<p>I am student body president at Brimm and softball player. Our coach has raised multiple concerns with AD regarding softball equipment. This has not been received. We only have 8 games on our schedule. We only received 10 belts left over from Wilson and what was in inventory. This is our senior year, we tell him we need more games but nothing is being done. Our coach is doing what he can, but the AD doesnt respond to emails until weeks later. If our AD continues to treat our softball team in this manner there will no longer be a CHS softball team.</p>
Silvia Espinal	<p>Hi. I am from Creative Arts. To piggy back of Jayda, I am part of the softball team. We lost players who feel like their time is not being valued. Soon as we came back from break three games were thrown at us back to back. We do not receive the support we need from the AD. We wanted to add games with other teams but we did not receive a response from the AD. This is not how we want to remember our senior year. He is not handling this problem professionally.</p>
Nancy Walker	<p>I am here tonight to appeal to the board that I have worked for for the last 34 years. Tonight I have an appeal to the decision makers to a decision that has an impact on the success of the school. I am here with the support and approval of most staff and my principal. Back in the 1990s challenged that the range between letter grade D and F represented a 60 point spread. The minimum grade is now a 50. No matter what grade you get, you get a 50. It becomes a nightmare. You can come to class and get a 77 and not do anymore work and pass the class. It is so easy to pass because the other grades turn to 50.</p> <p>The other issue is the 80 min block schedule...Although I believe that every change was made with good intention to impact instruction, I appeal to you with utmost respect to reconsider that the 82 minutes does not work for us.</p>

Sean Brown	<p>Good evening,</p> <p>I like to be seen so I am going to move over a little bit. So since the mid 2000s I have been paying attention to student data. There have been so many movements in</p>

		education since that time period. NCLB was the leading strategy...using the requirements that law gave. When I looked at the most recent data I was saddened to see that the line hasn't really gone up much. So I have a few questions... The first is, is there anything more we can do to encourage parents to take the education of their children more serious? At lot of us are dealing with childhood truama, mental health issues, etc. But what we are seeing is that we cannot let those things be an excuse to why they aren't committed to learning. We have fantastic students and teachers in our district. But the data still shows that something is broken. Look inside ourselves and by next month have a really good answer of what can we fundamentally do different in order to get better outcomes from our students.
Tywana Kiyaga		Thank Ms. McCombs for stopping by to see if anything has changed. Jakir could not be here but he sent a message, he said that the bathrooms have been fixed but the floors are not being properly cleaned. And I concur with his feedback. A concern for me is the door at the end of the hall at BPLA, on April 17th 3 people were let in the door by another student and that is a concern. I tried to prevent but was unsuccessful. We need a plan in place if something should happen what number do I call how do I report that immediately. I think that door should be one of the first for alarms. Our security at the time was not in the hall cause it was lunch time. Another concern is when I walk through the halls and see them not going to class. I think we need to ask them why they are in the halls and not going to class. We have to find out the why so that we can address it and get students to stay in class and get what they need.
Karen Borelli		Good evening, 82 minutes is not working. Students cannot sit that long all day long. It is not about the instructors, that is your answer. They cannot sit for 82 minutes, this is why you have students in the hallways. All you have to do is ask us and we will tell you. IImagine trying to teach PE but you have to watch the gym doors so that students cutting will not come in. Would you tolerate this due to delinquent children that are not disciplined? We have students to speak with top admin, why not do this with teachers? Before schedules are created. We have major issues after they are created. Bring us to the table. YOu have people that have 40 years, 30 years, 20 years. We are here to problem solve. Too many decisions are made on theory and not real application. I invite one of you to spend theday with me so you can see what we do everyday and see what we see. And see what answers you come up with.

We are making a lot of progress but I do want to point out that they do require that we provide transportation to these students regardless of their mileage. Addressing this will increase their attendance and help them excel academically. They spoke on the resources being provided such as public transportation tickets...however they are in a new country and unfamiliar with our public transportation.
